(b) A quantity of steam exists in a closed rigid vessel of volume 0.12 m^3 and it exerts a pressure of 8 bar at 200°C . If the vessel is cooled so that the pressure falls to 2.5 bar

- find the saturation temperature t_s corresponding to $p_1 = 8 \text{ bar}$
- which temperature is greater, $t_1 = 200^\circ\text{C}$ or t_s and what does this show of the initial condition of the steam at state 1?
- determine v_1 , the specific volume of the steam at state 1, hence determine the mass of the steam in the system
- determine the value of mv_{g2} at state 2, how does this value compare with the fixed volume of the vessel and what will be the condition of the steam in its final state (i.e. state 2)?
- find the dryness fraction at state 2
- determine the final temperature, heat transfer and change in entropy of the steam.
